There is a new initiative at the APA that we thought would be of interest - the APA Quality Measure Development for Behavioral Health Initiative! The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has offered grants to get

input from clinicians to develop quality measures that are clinically meaningful. One of CMS's highest priority areas for new quality measure development is mental health and substance use disorders. APA was one of seven organizations awarded a grant. With this grant, APA will

develop behavioral health quality measures that are meaningful to clinicians and

patients alike, by seeking crucial input from psychiatrists and other mental health providers across the country. APA will leverage its PsychPRO clinical data registry electronic platform to collect data and test new measures. The Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act of 2015 authorized CMS to

provide incentives that encourage physicians to focus on quality, value of care and patient health. Benefits for your participation in PsychPRO and this measure development initiative include: A tablet computer for your practice so that you and your patients can
easily access the online portal to complete the required assessments;

- If you do not have an EHR, the ability to collect 2019 QPP quality data If you are a non-APA member, your registration fee for joining PsychPRO will be covered for the 3-year funding period;
- A \$500 honorarium for your efforts; Acknowledgement of support in journal and white paper publications;
 An interactive dashboard to drill-down to patient-level information and
- data assessing quality;
- Access to patient-reported outcome data in real-time via a portal to engage patients, help in treatment planning and follow-up care. PROMs included in APA's PsychPRO registry are:
- o Currently: DSM-5 Cross-cutting measure, PHQ-9, GAD-7, Audit-C, PROMIS -Pain, NIDA - Assist, WHODAS 2.0, Child/Adult ADHD, IQ Code. o Planned: PROMIS Toolkit, Falls, Cognitive measures, and many more.

APA is looking forward to playing a key role in developing quality measures that best reflect the quality service that is being delivered every day in the field and since you are one of our early adopters who have expressed interest in using

The program aims to expand the network of local buprenorphine trainers nation-wide, increase the number of buprenorphine trainings, and expand the number of buprenorphine-waivered providers to increase access to MAT. March Course of the Month - TMS Therapy for the Treatment of Depression A decade after the Food and Drug Administration cleared the treatment, many psychiatrists are unfamiliar with the literature about Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation (TMS) and are not aware of its value and benefit to patients suffering with depression. This talk, presented by Mark S. George, M.D., of the Medical University of South Carolina, provides an overview of the basics of neurobiology of depression and the history of TMS. It also introduces the technology of TMS, proposed mechanisms of actions, and discusses the benefits and risks of TMS


